Grey Literature and Book Sources

More than **750** sources

From **22** countries

Make up **25%** of yearly content

76% provide full text

12% provide peer-reviewed content

55% of sources indexed more than **10** years

20-30 sources added per year

40% of sources indexed

56% nonprofits, organizations, associations, etc.

11% state and local education agencies

15% Department of Education and other federal sources

8% international

9% book publishers

Journals

More than **1,250** journals

99% peer-reviewed

Make up **75%** of yearly content

30 to 50 new journals added per year

60% of journals indexed more than **10** years

35% provide full text

Journal Publishers

From **26** countries

535 publishers

9 large publishers provide

50% of journal content

443 contribute one journal

Individuals

Make up almost **3%** of yearly content

Over **750** non-grantee submissions per year

Over **500** grantee submissions per year
