CLIA MSA Viewer User's Guide



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INTRODUCTION

Congress passed the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) in 1988 establishing quality standards for all laboratory testing to ensure the accuracy, reliability, and timeliness of patient test results regardless of where the test was performed. The final CLIA regulations were published in the Federal Register on February 28, 1992. The requirements are based on the complexity of the test and not the type of laboratory where the testing is performed. On January 24, 2003, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) published final CLIA Quality Systems laboratory regulations that became effective April, 24, 2003.

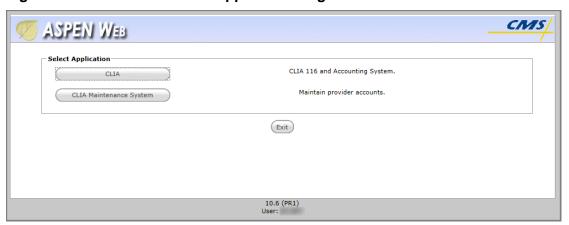
CLIA Medicaid State Agency (MSA) extract files are used to scrutinize Medicaid claims to ensure that billed laboratory services are authorized under a provider's CLIA certificate. MSA files are created weekly on Saturday mornings.

This *CLIA MSA Viewer User's Guide* describes how CMS Central Office CLIA personnel can use the MSA Viewer features of the ASPEN Web CLIA system to view and download MSA files. This guide is intended for use primarily by CMS CLIA personnel.

ACCESS THE MSA VIEWER

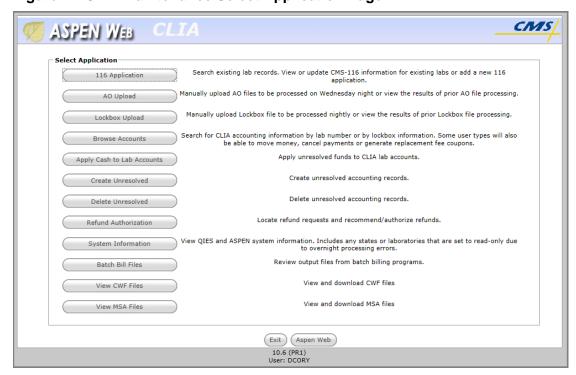
The MSA Viewer is available as part of the ASPEN Web CLIA system. To access the MSA Viewer you must first log into ASPEN Web. Upon successful login to ASPEN Web, the ASPEN Web **Select Application** page (Figure 1) is presented.

The ASPEN Web **Select Application** page presents *CLIA* and *CLIA Maintenance System* options. Select the *CLIA* item. The CLIA **Select Application** page (Figure 2) is presented.

Figure 2. CLIA Maintenance Select Application Page

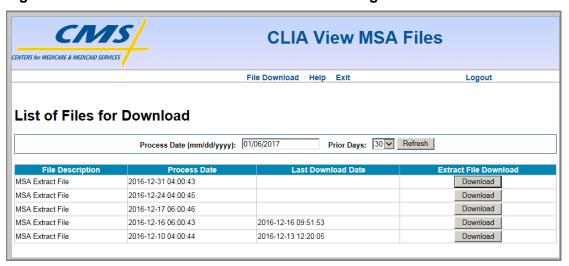


The CLIA **Select Application** page presents the following options:

- 116 Application
- AO Upload
- Lockbox Upload
- Browse Accounts
- Apply Cash to Lab Accounts
- Create Unresolved
- Delete Unresolved
- Refund Authorization
- System Information
- Batch Bill Files
- View CWF Files
- View MSA Files

Select the *View MSA Files* option. The CLIA View MSA Files **List of Files for Download** page (Figure 3) is presented.

MSA VIEWER NAVIGATION

Each page of the MSA Viewer includes a menu bar (Figure 4) that provides access to the features of the MSA Viewer.

The MSA Viewer menu bar offers the following links:

Link Name	Action
File Download	Select the <u>File Download</u> link to access the MSA Viewer List of Files for Download page to view the available MSA files and download one or more as needed.
Help	Select the Help link to access the MSA Viewer Help options page.
Exit	Select the Exit link to return to the CLIA Select Application page.
Logout	Select the Logout link to log out of ASPEN Web.

For those users who wish to navigate the MSA Viewer features without a mouse, the following keyboard shortcut keys are available to bring focus to items on the MSA Viewer menu bar:

Shortcut Keys	To Access
Alt + 1	CLIA Maintenance Select Application page
Alt + x	List of Files for Download page
Alt + p	Help page
Alt + o	Logout

With focus on one of these items, press the Enter key to access the associated page or activate the function.

When utilizing the keyboard to navigate the system, use Alt + n if you wish to bypass the MSA Viewer menu bar and go directly to the first field on a page.

NOTE: Shortcut keys utilizing numbers function only with the numeric keys along the top of the keyboard. They do not function with the numeric keys in the "10-key" pad of the keyboard.

LIST OF FILES FOR DOWNLOAD PAGE FUNCTIONALITY

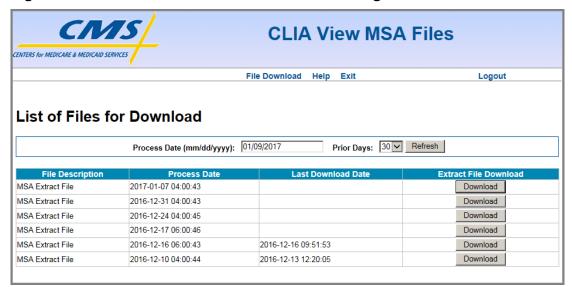


Figure 5. MSA Viewer List of Files for Download Page

The MSA Viewer **List of Files for Download** page includes functionality with which you may search for and view a list of the available MSA files and download those of interest. The **List of Files for Download** page (Figure 5) is presented by default when the MSA Viewer option is accessed from the CLIA **Select Application** page. You may return to the **List of Files for Download** page at any time by selecting the *File Download* item on the MSA Viewer menu bar.

The **List of Files for Download** page displays, in tabular format, one record (row) for each MSA weekly extract file. By default, the **List of Files for Download** page lists the MSA files that were uploaded in the last 30 days in descending Process Date order (most recent first).

The table displaying the available file records includes the following column headings:

- File Description "MSA Extract File"
- Process Date the date and time the file was created
- Last Download Date the date MSA file was last downloaded
- Extract File Download contains a **Download** button with which you may download and review the associated MSA file.

The **List of Files for Download** page includes the following elements with which you may specify alternate criteria for selecting the CWF files to list:

Field (text box): Process Date (mm/dd/yyyy)

• Field (drop-down list): *Prior Days*

• Button: Refresh

The *Process Date* field value defaults to the current date and the *Prior Days* field value initially defaults to 30. With these criteria, the MSA file(s) processed today and for the last 30 days display. Change the *Process Date* and/or the *Prior Days* field values to limit or expand the list. *Prior Days* options include 0, 1, 2, 5, 10, and 30. After changing the criteria, select the **Refresh** button to perform the new query for available MSA files.

For example, if you wish to view a list of the uploaded files for yesterday and today, leave the current date in the *Process Date* field and change the *Prior Days* field value to 1. If the *Prior Days* field value is 0, only MSA files processed today display.

NOTE: MSA files are retained for 234 weeks.

The following keyboard shortcut keys are available to bring focus to items on the MSA Viewer **File Download** page:

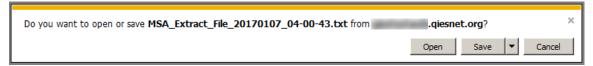
Shortcut Keys	To Access
Alt + 2	Process Date field
Alt + 3	Prior Days field
Alt + s	Refresh button

NOTE: Shortcut keys utilizing numbers function only with the numeric keys along the top of the keyboard. They do not function with the numeric keys in the "10-key" pad of the keyboard.

To download and view an MSA file, Select the **Download** button associated with the MSA file of interest. A **File Open or Save** dialog box (Figure 6) opens.

NOTE: The appearance of the **File Open or Save** dialog box varies depending upon the version of the browser you are using.

When you select the **Open** button, the file opens your computer's default text editor (Figure 7).

NOTE: An MSA file is large and may take several moments to open. You may elect to save the file to your computer before attempting to open and view it.

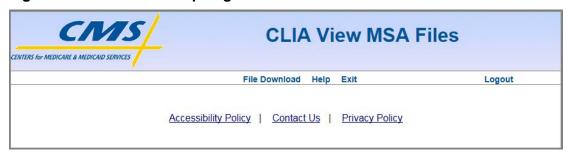

Alt + 9	Privacy Policy link

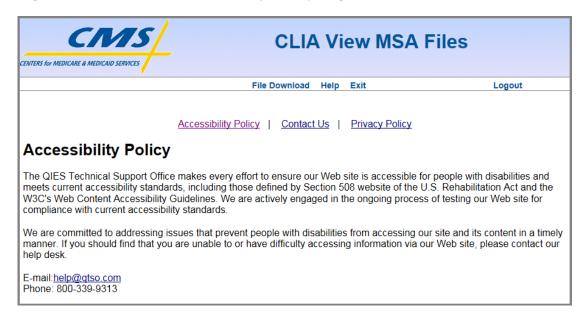
With focus on one of these links, press the Enter key to activate the link and access the associated page.

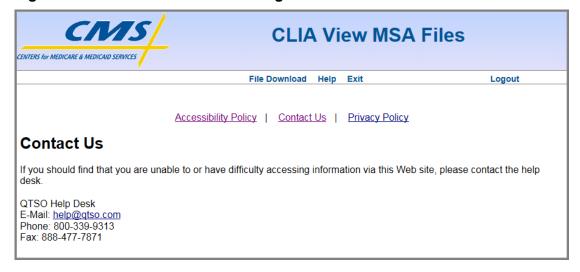

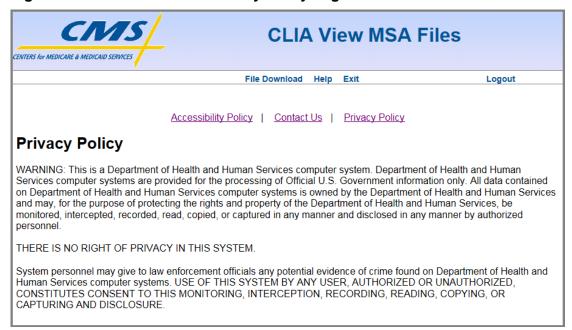
