Interesting Facts from SSA's National Beneficiary Survey (NBS)

How many SSA beneficiaries with disabilities work or have work goals? How many have recently demonstrated their interest in working?

- Almost one-third (31%) of all SSA beneficiaries with disabilities have goals that include work and/or career advancement.
 - ♦ Nearly 9% of all SSA beneficiaries were already working at the time of interview.
 - ♦ Approximately 13% of all SSA beneficiaries worked in the year prior to interview (2003).
 - Almost 27% see themselves working in the next five years and 21% sees themselves working in the next year.

Sees self working for pay in the next year	20.5%	22.2%	18.2%	24.9%
Sees self working for pay in the next five years	26.9%	31.1%	22.7%	32.6%
